Progress Update: Jenna Morra Wood





The first phase of the riverside path has now been completed and it is possible to walk along its full length. There is however a very wet muddy patch towards the top end which will require more work. It had originally been intended to construct a wooden boardwalk at this point. Now that it has been possible to clear this area with a mini-digger, it has been decided that a cheaper and longer lasting option will be to get the digger back to create some drains and install culverts to divert the water off the path, thus hopefully allowing it to dry out, also using some stone found on site to provide a better surface where it is muddy. The path will also be extended to run parallel with the farm track coming out of the wood at the Old Weil, this will require an additional culvert and some earth moving where there is a burn to cross. It is hoped that this work can be carried out later this year.
