Now children of all ages can explore new play areas, packed with opportunities to climb, swing, learn new skills, and make lifelong friends.

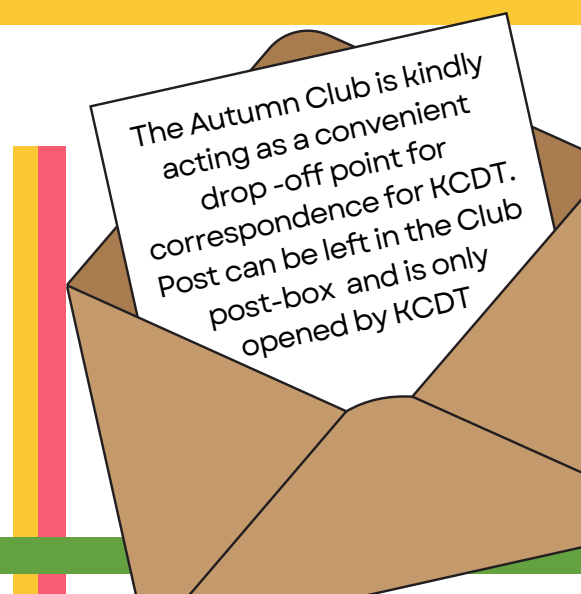
This isn't just a playpark – it's a vibrant community hub we can all celebrate and enjoy for years to come!

## Winter Fuel Grants

This year's community winter fuel grants of £250 per eligible household in Kirkcowan are available. **You should have received an email or a letter detailing how you claim your grant.** Applications are open from October 2025 and close on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2026 so do put in your claim asap to make sure you don't miss out.

## Kirkcowan Education and Training Fund GRANTS for individuals of up to £2,000 available

### What is it?

A fund that can support you in obtaining new skills and qualifications to help you find employment or advance in your work. Awards can support costs that are directly related to attending your course or apprenticeship, including course fees, study and technical aids and equipment, travel and subsistence, accommodation, childcare to allow you to study. Courses must be approved by the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) or similar.

### Who is it for?

Anyone aged 16 or over who lives in **Kirkcowan**

### Driving Test grants also available

Kirkcowan is a rural community at some distance from the local service town and from infrastructure such as statutory facilities. The ability to drive is a significant factor in reaching employment, education and training opportunities, and to quality of life in an area with poor public transport infrastructure.

The sum available is £23 for the car theory test and either £62 or £75 for the driving test for cars depending on whether it's a weekday or evening/weekend/bank holiday.

£23 for the motorcycle theory test and either £75 or £88.50 for the on-road motorcycle text depending on whether it's taken on a weekday or evening/weekend/bank holiday.
